



Slips, trips, and falls prevention for mining plants

Don't fall for it!

Slips, trips and falls (STF) continue to be a primary source of incidents in the mining sector, as well as other industries. Here are some safety tips to prevent STF hazards from creating the potential for injuries for **mining plants and elevated work areas**.

Be aware of...	Use this best practice!
✘ Unsecured openings (from removed equipment, piping, or ducting)	✓ Ensure unsecured openings are barricaded and identified, and that open holes have securely-fastened covers
✘ Raised platforms that can render standard guardrails ineffective	✓ Lift systems, and hard-locking swing gates instead of chain-type rails at ladder tops
✘ Unmarked, untextured walkways	✓ Regular inspection and repair of wooden, metal, and concrete walkways
✘ Unsafe ladder use practices	✓ Minimizing ladder use, and applying fall protection as required
✘ Stairways creating the opportunity for slips, trips and falls	✓ Building stairs to an engineering standard with proper handrails, along with mandatory three-point contact rules
✘ Environments with bright sunlight that can obscure footing	✓ Safety sunglasses to reduce glare and improve visibility
✘ Slippery shop floors from oil and grease or worn cement surfaces	✓ Textured floor finishes that are regularly cleaned and maintained
✘ Trip hazards, including cables, cords, and hoses	✓ Organizing cables and hoses with floor mats, overhead cable arms, or designated pathways
