against or struck by object)

Transportation (non-highway incident, except rail, air, water)

Bodily reactions and exertions, includes overexertion from pushing, pulling, or lifting objects; slipping on something without fall; bending, climbing, crawling, reaching, twisting; repetitive motions; turning the body while lifting.



Falls, includes falls to floor, walkway, or other surface; falls onto or against objects; falls down stairs or steps; jumps to lower level.
