- occupational health and safety;
- public relations.

Qualifications

Director shall:

- be at the date of his/her election and thereafter remain throughout his/her term, a Member of the Corporation;
- be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- not be an undischarged bankrupt;
- be and remain in compliance with the Corporation's Code of Ethics and the Conflict-of-Interest Policy; and
- fulfill the competency requirements for Board membership as determined and set out by the Nominating and Recruitment Committee.



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Attributes

Candidates should demonstrate the following attributes:

- Integrity and high ethical standards;
- Intellectual capacity for conceptual and strategic thinking;
- Ability to cut through complex issues and ask incisive questions;
- Independent judgment;
- Candour and the willingness to table difficult issues;
- Willingness to act on and be accountable for decisions;
- The interpersonal skills to work collegially within and outside WSN, and to express views in a
 way that is both challenging and supportive; and
- Commitment to prepare for and attend meetings on a regular basis.

Time Commitment

- Commits to attending all Board meetings, sub-committee meetings and a Board orientation meeting for new directors.
 - The Board meetings are scheduled from 8:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m. (4 hours each, typically four meetings annually)
 - The Sub-committee meetings are scheduled for 1.5 hours each, typically three meetings annually. Specific sub-committees may host special meetings to address pressing matters
