





### ISO/IEC 17024 International Accreditation Standard for Certification of Persons

- The key issues that ISO 17024 tackles can be summarized as:
  - Defining what it is you examine (the competencies knowledge, skills, abilities) and standardized eligibility requirements
  - Examination must be independent from training/training providers
  - Examination must be a valid and reliable assessment tool
  - Certification scheme must safeguard impartiality
  - Effective Management System must be in place

### Certification Standards and the Impact on the OHS Profession

- Define scope and function of OHS professional and technical positions
- College/University Degree/Diploma Programs
  - impact on development of programs
- Employers/Hiring Practices
  - pre-screening/prequalification for hiring
  - Requirement for advancement/incentives
- Public Confidence
  - certified individual has demonstrated competence, ethical compliance, and ongoing commitment to professional development

- Recertification Requirements (Continuous Professional Development Requirement)
  - Lifelong Learning for the OSH Professional verification of continuing competence
- Equivalency Modules for CRSPs
  - Module 1: Professional Skills

  - Module 4: CRSP Rules of Professional Conduct




OSH Professional Competence Framework

## Conseil Canadien Des Professionnels Singapore Accord

- September 3, Singapore Accord was signed by over 40 OHS organizations, including the BCRSP
- The Accord is an agreement by major OHS Practitioner Organisations around the globe to aspire towards a standard of OHS Professional behaviour and practice
- For certification bodies:

As OHS certification bodies and credentialing organisations – [the framework can be used] as a resource in the development of our certification standards and designations, and other assessment processes;





#### BCRSP & the INSHPO Framework

The Board supports the INSHPO Capability Framework and is using it as a benchmark to assess our certification offerings
