

After a workplace fatality where a young worker was struck by a locomotive underground, a new mining innovation called a track switch indicator was successfully implemented at Kirkland Lake Gold's Holt Mine and Mill Complex. The technology, developed by Philippe Rail, a welder and fabricator, uses neon light indicators (red and green) to display the direction that the haulage track is currently set to which helps reduce the risk of workers being struck by moving equipment. This presentation will discuss the implementation of this safety innovation from conception to completion.




