

Heat stress in the mining industry has been a cause for concern for many decades. Whether on-surface, underground or in-plant, Canadian miners perform physically demanding jobs that, when combined with exposure to hot environments, can lead to dangerous elevations in core temperature and burden the entire body. When compounded by a progressive state of dehydration, miners are at an elevated risk of developing a heat-related injury (e.g., severe fatigue, heat exhaustion, heat-induced fainting, acute kidney injury). Given that heat stress is projected to increase in severity with rising global temperatures, occupational heat stress prevention and management are of critical importance to prevent adverse heat-health effects and support safe and effective work.

To date, there is only a superficial understanding of the key factors contributing to excessive heat stress and strain in the mining industry, which limits our ability to design practical heat-mitigation strategies to safeguard worker health and safety. To better understand these issues, we are undertaking two Canada-wide surveys in collaboration with the mining industry. The first survey assesses the determinants of heat stress and strain from the worker's perspective. The second is a survey of personnel responsible for the health and safety of company workers aimed at evaluating heat risk management methodologies and practices. The survey findings will increase awareness and knowledge about the importance of heat stress prevention and management programs that can be widely adopted and implemented by member organizations across Canada.

2021 Totten Mine Evacuation

Danny Taillefer Mine Rescue Officer Ontario Mine Rescue

Ontario Mine Rescue Officer Danny Taillefer talks about getting it right when it matters most. In September 2021 Vale's Totten Mine experienced an unplanned event in the main shaft travel way that prevented access into and exit from the mine workings.

Over the course of three days Vale and Ontario Mine Rescue conducted an operation sending mine rescue volunteers into the mine to set-up and execute a safe evacuation of the mine via the secondary egress ladderways.

This presentation will review the events, challenges, and solutions as experienced by those working underground to ensure all mine workers returned home safely to their families.
